ADULT EDUCATION WITH DON WELLS JUNE 11 AND 18

The Trail of Tears – Not Just the Cherokees – June 11

In many states the school system's curriculum allows for a short unit on the forced relocation of the Indians. Generally only the Cherokee Removal from August 1838 to March 1839 is all that is included. In fact the removal period began in 1790 and continued until the late 1850's. All of the Five Civilized Tribes were affected.

This presentation discusses the removal of the Cherokee, Choctaw, Chickasaw, Creek and Seminole from southeastern America. The pain and suffering for these indigenous peoples and the long term impact on their lives is presented in order to provide a more comprehensive understanding of the Indian Removal.

Indian Spirituality – As told by the Elders - June 18

Over the past decade, we have spent a lot of time with the elders learning from them about many aspects of their culture. Indian Spirituality is a very private matter to them but some elders shared their knowledge about some aspect of the spiritual culture in filmed interviews. More has been learned from books written about spirituality and visits with them on field trips. All of this information has been put together in this presentation to provide an insight into traditional Indian Spirituality.
