MUTUAL MINISTRY REVIEW

On Sunday, May 27 parishioners will have their first opportunity to participate in the Mutual Ministry Review. During the sermon time at both services, the review will be distributed with instructions for filling it out. What is a mutual ministry review? A Mutual Ministry Review (MMR) offers a chance to consider comprehensively all aspects of parish life. On a regular basis the clergy, the vestry, and the parish need to assess how effectively we are fulfilling our responsibilities to each other and to the wider community. The MMR provides a framework for assessing and celebrating all the ministries of the parish, as well as a means to identify areas for future growth and development.

Your Vestry has made final preparations to conduct the MMR for the 12-month period June 2017 through May 2018. We actively solicit input from all parishioners. We deeply value everyone's perspective and would greatly appreciate your participation in this process by completing the survey.

After May 27, the MMR will be posted on the website, and copies circulated on Sundays into June. The vestry will compile all the results in mid-June and publish the responses by the beginning of July. *G. Yandell for the vestry*
