THE BOOKS OF COMMON PRAYER: THEIR HISTORY AND CONTENT

This offering will be led by the clergy of the parish. If you wish to read ahead to prepare for class sessions, this is the line-up:

- **July 22:** Content will include the Daily Offices and the Liturgical Calendar (the collects, the Church’ s keeping of time and its rhythms), sanctifying life, time and space. Daily 2-year lectionary and the Sunday/Feast Days and the 3-year lectionary; the Prayer Book psalter and how it’ s different from the NRSV.
- **July 29:** The Eucharist and options in the 1979 BCP- how are they different, when might they be used, what are their theologies?
- **August 5:** Baptism and its history in the Church in different precincts- the major changes from the 1928 book in the 1979 rite.
- **August 12:** The Pastoral Offices- marriage, reconciliation of a penitent, ministrations to the sick, ministrations at the time of death, burial.
- **August 19:** Confirmation and Episcopal Services (Ordinations, Celebration of New Ministry, Consecration of a Church) and Historical documents. *G. Yandell*

PICK A BIN, ANY BIN!

Have you been confused by the number of donation bins lining the wall as you enter the Parish Hall? Why do we have so many? Who are they for? What are we supposed to donate and why?

We at Holy Family have a strong history of meeting the needs of the people of Pickens County through both donations of funds and goods. And, the Outreach Ministry is in constant search for the best ways to support those needs. To that end, the number of donation opportunities has increased.

From left to right as you face the bins:

- **CARES:** Pickens County residents meet with a Food Assistance Counselor to determine need. Clients may receive food once per week. CARES is open twice per week for food distribution. About 150 clients are served each week. Much of the food products come from the Atlanta Food Bank. Paper products are always needed (toilet paper, paper towels, diapers, etc.).
- **ACES:** Up to ten teenagers are housed temporarily at ACES, which provides a safe, secure, and nurturing home. They are always in need of laundry detergent, paper towels, bottled waters, and toiletries. Think teenagers!
- **North Georgia Community Action (NGCA):** Open daily, the Food Pantry at NGCA provides emergency food and non-food items for our neighbors in need. Food that require little to no extra ingredients meet these needs the best. See the detailed list above the labeled bin.
